## Tesco Opening

The opening ceremony of the new Tesco Extra store was performed by the Mayor of Bradley Stoke, Councillor Robert Jones, at 10.00am on Monday 13 October 2008. Its success was toasted with champagne and cutting a cake. Tesco Charity Trust donated a further £1000 to the Mayor's Charity (National Association for Colitis and Crohn's Disease) on this occasion. The store will employ some 600 people. Many of the adjoining retail units were also open for business although further large retail units are still under construction. Work had already begun on emptying the old store prior to its demolition in preparation for completion of the car park. Over 30,000 people visited the store during its first week of operation.


## Christmas Hamper Appeal 2008

## Toucan crossing

Council has approved South Glos Councils proposals to upgrade the light controlled crossing on Savages Wood Road to a Toucan as well as the two light controlled crossings on Bradley Stoke Way between the Leisure and Town Centres. The necessity of audible warning signals was stressed for the visually disadvantaged.



# BSTC Play Area Improvements

Work on the proposed Beacon Play Scheme for installation at the Jubilee Green in Savages Wood Road is well underway. It will be based on a 'natural' landscaped area designed to attract people of all ages in a range of pursuits from just sitting to vigorous activity. Public consultation on the architect's proposals will take place shortly.

2008 has seen considerable improvements to several of the Bradley Stoke Town Council Play Areas. Upgrades have been carried out to Baileys Court and Paddock Close and the Rosemary Close Play Area has been completely replaced.

During 2007 some upgrading to the Brook Way Play Area took place - a new Car Springer and a four-way see-saw was installed and is proving to be very popular. Baileys Court has had a new gravity rider vortex and a new Springer installed. Due to changing regulations the existing surface was no longer big enough for these items so they were put on the grass with adjacent safety tiles. Paddock Close was painted by two of our staff, and Foxborough Gardens is next on the list, when time and the weather allows. The biggest project was to replace the existing equipment originally commissioned by Barrett Homes and installed by Welsco in 1997 at Rosemary Close, which was subsequently passed over to Bradley Stoke Town Council. A community Consultation was carried out by Southern Brooks Community Partnership in November 2007 to see what should replace the existing play equipment. The popular items were Slides, Climbing, Rocker /see-saw and swings. We were asked for the age range to include upper primary to reflect that the children in the area are older now. The new play equipment items installed are:

- All Steel Venturer Configuration Multiplay unit
- Devils Island Swing which is like a basket and suits all ages and abilities
- Dragonfly reclined See-Saw
- Racing Car Springer
- Elephant Springer which is suitable for less able bodied children
- Post Office Play Panel for the youngest imaginative play
- Plus new litter bin, bench, wet pour surfacing and two new gates.

All Bradley Stoke Town Council controlled Play Areas undergo regular recorded checks for wear & tear and vandalism; of which unfortunately there is quite a bit. This is always reported to the police by BSTC staff that have passed the RoSPA RPII Routine Inspections exam and are now on the National Register of Play Area Inspectors. They are also inspected annually by an outside professional body.

A quantity of beach sand was deposited on the Jubilee green during August as an experiment to see how well it would be received with the view to including a sand feature in the Beacon Play Scheme. It was well used by children for building sand castles and by families for picnics and proved a huge success. It was checked daily to keep it free from all contamination and nothing was found that gave cause for concern.

# Fireworks 2008

The sixth Bradley Stoke Town Council Annual Fireworks display took place at the Jubilee Centre in Savages Wood Road on Sunday 2 November. Thousands of residents watched as the Kimbolton Fireworks display lit up the sky in a breathtaking fashion. Hot food and drinks were once again provided by the Bristol Aztec Rotary, supported by local traders. Some £2,200 was raised towards the Mayor's Annual Charity National Association for Colitis and Crohn's Disease (NACC).

Among discussions on provision for youth throughout Bradley Stoke over the next two or three years was the hire of a mobile youth facility for two nights each week, initially for a six month period. Known as 'Urbi' it would, in effect, be 'detached youth work' in addition to the two nights already undertaken by Southern Brooks Community Partnership. The cost of the 'Urbi' vehicle, including staffing, would be in the region of £8000 of which Patchway Town Council has agreed to finance a third since it would also benefit Patchway parish.

According to the Regional Spatial Strategy for the South West, some 33,000 new houses are proposed for the area. Whilst none of the new development is planned for Bradley Stoke, the Town Council expressed concerns for such things as increased traffic and increased demands on services such as health and education, libraries and sports facilities. The infrastructure including the motorways is clearly not capable of handling large volumes of traffic. Over 30,000 people visited the new Tesco Extra during its first week of operation, which gives an indication of things to come. Further housing developments in the adjoining districts will lead to an increased traffic flow. The Town Council also takes the view that any incursion into Green Belt land should only be undertaken where special circumstances can be demonstrated.

# Postal Scam!

The advice concerning the Postal Scam outlined below has come to us from several sources, including the Police, Royal Mail and Trading Standards who are all keen to make people aware of the following scam:

“A card is posted through your door from a company called PDS (Parcel Delivery Service) suggesting that they were unable to deliver a parcel and that you need to contact them on 0906 6611911 (a premium rate number). Do NOT call this number, as this is a mail scam originating from Belize. If you call the number and you start to hear a recorded message, you will already have been billed £15.00 for the telephone call.”

## Changes to Sort It!\* Centres

This is an update to the article in the September edition of South Gloucestershire News, which provided details of key changes to the Sort It!\* Centres to control trader abuse as well as help to reduce cross border tipping by residents outside South Gloucestershire. Automatic Number Plate Recognition Cameras will be installed in early November with an official launch date w/c the 1st of December 2008 and at the same time the following restrictions will also be implemented:

- Asbestos sheets will be limited to a maximum of 12 sheets but all must be double wrapped in sealed plastic for health and safety reasons.
- Households will only be able to dispose of four car and motorcycle tyres a year and will be encouraged to use the tyre fitters' disposal options.
- Disposal of petrol and diesel will not be allowed for site health and safety reasons.
- Fire extinguishers, except household size ones, will not be accepted.
- Gas bottles will not be accepted – residents will be requested to take them back to the original supplier for recycling.
- Only one gallon of used engine oil can be disposed of per visit. Engine oil is also collected at the kerbside.
- Trailers with double axles or with box sizes longer than 2 metres will no longer be allowed onto the sites. Manoeuvring larger trailers, often used by traders, causes disruption and delays for other users
- Construction and demolition waste e.g. rubble and soil will be limited to reasonable amounts relating to small DIY projects and SITA will be monitoring and assessing this.

These restrictions are designed to restrict trade use, deter cross border users and minimise service disruption for local residents. South Glos Council have also adopted a fly tipping strategy, which will be proactively pursued.

## Election Result for Bradley Stoke Town Council

The result of the Meadowbank Ward, Bradley Stoke election held on Thursday 2nd October 2008 was that Cllr Jon Williams was duly elected as a replacement for Cllr Caroline Charlton.

## Best Buddies Project

The Volunteer Centres in South Gloucestershire have secured funding to help adults with learning difficulties to become involved in community activities, with the assistance of a volunteer 'buddy'.

The aim of the project is to help reduce social isolation amongst adults with learning disabilities, enabling them to enjoy community and voluntary activities, encouraging choice and independence. The Volunteer Centres are looking for people able to give a few hours a week to become a "buddy". The 'buddies' will provide support to a person with learning difficulties when they start volunteering or a community activity. This may involve encouraging independence in the use of public transport, working alongside them when they start volunteering and meeting to talk about interests or joining in activities. Volunteers may be:

- Older people recently retired or with some spare time
- Students wanting to build their portfolio of skills and experience
- People with learning difficulties who are able to share their experiences to support others
- Employees whose organisations encourage them to volunteer
- Anyone over the age of 18 wanting to learn new skills and make a difference in their community

# Bradley Stoke United Score with Football Foundation Grant

The meeting rooms at the Jubilee Centre have recently been enhanced with fresh paint on the walls and new carpet tiles, replacing the rather tired originals that had become stained and worn.

The Town Council opposed suggestions from the Ministry of Justice that voting opportunities might be extended to the weekend. It was observed that if people wanted to vote they would, if not they wouldn't, so tinkering with the days would have no worthwhile effect.

A tarmac surface has replaced the rough car park at Baileys Court Activity Centre and parking spaces have been marked that greatly improve the capacity of the park.

## Severn Vale Art Trail 2009

The Severn Vale Art Trail is to go ahead again in 2009 from 2 to 10 May. The trail extends from Almondsbury to Berkeley on either side of the A38 and will be preceded by a "Showcase Exhibition" in Thornbury Town Hall during the Thornbury Arts Festival week 17 – 26 April 2009.

A wide range of Art and Crafts by local Artists (painting, sculpture, batik, textiles, basket weaving, pottery, stained glass and jewellery) will be found on the trail and on display in local shops. A colour brochure will be distributed via Thornbury Town Hall and local shops, pubs and restaurants, and this will show an example of each Artist's work, their venue address and times of opening. From this you will be able to organise your own trail to make an entertaining excursion. A clear map and signs show the location of each venue.

All work is of high quality and Artists are on hand to explain how they go about their work. The Thornbury Arts Festival committee are pleased to add this Visual Arts aspect to its already popular festival week and are keen for local Artists to share and promote their work. It is certainly fascinating to discover the talent and variety of Arts and Crafts on our own doorstep. Any new Artists wishing to take part in the Art Trail will be very welcome. you will be able to meet other Artists. The Castle School Visual Arts Department are giving their support and are keen to build contacts with local businesses, which will benefit their students. ## Bradley Stoke Neighbourhood Policing Team

Wpc Claire Fletcher will be leaving the beat at the beginning of December to be replaced by PC Steve Palmer. Steve will be joining PCSO Kirsty Flicker and PCSO Jason GREEN.

We have successfully worked in partnership with the "Safer South Gloucestershire" anti-social behaviour team due to reports of the same youths being involved in minor anti-social behaviour. This has resulted in these young people signing Anti-social Behaviour contracts. The PCSO's are continuing their work within all the local primary schools delivering educational packages, most recently around Halloween. Every relevant retail outlet was visited and advice regarding the sale of "eggs and flour" all this helped us have a relatively quiet evening.

The team have been liaising closely with the new Willow Brook centre establishing good relationships with security and the new outlets to promote partnership working. The PCSO's have held a "Have your say" day within the centre answering shoppers' questions and giving crime prevention advice.

On the subject of crime reduction with Christmas approaching please be extra vigilant, don't leave your Christmas shopping on view in the car, if possible avoid presents being on display underneath your tree and check on elderly and vulnerable neighbours with the weather now getting colder.
